- Reduce the cost of medical treatment and eliminate obstacles to accessing health services.
- Enhance the immediacy and quality of medical services through smart healthcare.

Issues this webinar will address:

- How to increase universal health coverage and the quality of healthcare services.
- How to integrate resources of local hospitals to reduce the cost of healthcare and inconvenient transportation in order to improve access to health services.
- How to promote the immediacy and quality of health services through smart healthcare

Contents:

-Access to health services:

- Introduce community integrated health networks and hierarchical medical policies in Taiwan.
- Share Taiwan's social welfare policies and National Health Insurance (NHI).
- Introduce the establishment of telemedicine outpatient clinics in central hospitals to overcome economic and environmental barriers.

-Access to health service information:

- Introduce Taiwan's development of telemedicine basics for the 5G action plan and exceptional ICT advantages.
- Introduce Internet of Things and telemedicine platforms, including portable smart technology medical equipment, to provide more comprehensive medical care in rural areas

- Government officials from divisions in charge of health services, officials from the Ministry of Health and Welfare or the Ministry of Science and Technology, or members of the private sector/NGOs/international organizations.
- Preferable background: Healthcare or social welfare, smart medicine or telemedicine/ telehealth industry.
- Experience: A minimum of two years of progressive experience conducting health service research, implementation of healthcare policies or telemedicine topics, and other related fields are preferred.
